Course Objectives: The objective of this course is to expose the student to both the conceptual

and practical aspects of auditing. The course will provide the student with opportunities to improve written and oral communication skills, critical thinking, and interpersonal skills. In addition to the topics in the textbook,

international auditing and ethics will be discussed.

Format: This course will utilize lectures, class discussions, case studies, videotapes,

and student presentations. Assigned chapters should be read before class, and assignments should be prepared to be turned in on due dates. Late assignments will not be accepted. The course requires students to do a substantial amount of writing, and writing will contribute significantly to the

course grade. Writing will be used to promote the learning of the course material and provide interaction between the instructor and the student.

Examinations: Exams will include both multiple choice questions, short essays and

problems. Students may find it helpful to review CPA exam review

books (Delaney).

Attendance: Attendance will contribute toward the final grade of the course only if the

student is on the borderline between two grades. The student is responsible

for all announcements and material covered during his/her absence.

Requirements:

The student will hand in written assignments which should always be typed and preferably double-spaced. These will be graded and returned to the student. A minimum of one oral presentation is required of each student. Assignments require the use of word-processing, spreadsheets, and possibly data bases at the Hamilton Library.
