The goal of the Maili Land Transitional Housing Program is to provide assistance to families with children who are homeless, and to help them gain a significant degree of self-sufficiency and obtain long-term permanent Housing.

## **Learning Objective:** Upon completion of the class, students will

- 1. Understand basic camera operations and functions.
- 2. Be able to shoot pictures on manual camera settings.
- **3.** Understand the basic elements and principles of shooting photographic images.
- **4.** Obtain a greater knowledge of different photography styles (i.e. Fashion, Documentary, Portrait, Commercial, Landscape, etc...).
- **5.** Be able to critique photographic images based on elements and principals of photography.
- **6.** Obtain a greater awareness of the dynamics of poverty in Hawaii, and their civic responsibility.
- 7. Demonstrate an understanding of and commitment to their role in issues of public concern.
- **8.** Demonstrate internalization of the values associated with service-learning.
