Description: Learn, develop and understand the writing skills used in newspapers, magazines, television and radio.

Requirements:

Attendance. Regular, on time attendance is expected. Failure to attend class will negatively affect your grade. Absence due to illness must be accompanied by a doctor's note. Athletes should have a letter from his/her coach prior to missing class.

Participation. There will be ample opportunity for group discussions. Positive participation is expected.

In-Class Assignments. There will be in-class assignments once a week.

External Assignments. This is a writing course, so students can expect many writing assignments. There will be at least one assignment due each week.

Exams. There will be a final examination for this class: an exercise in news writing.

Final Portfolio. The final project for this class is a portfolio of writing, including at least one story published in the Chaminade Times.

Outside Reading. You are expected to read at least the headlines and the leads of the front-page stories of the Honolulu Advertiser and The New York Times each day.

Grading:

10 % attendance 10% each for four writing exercises, and 20% for the final exam 30%: The Chaminade Times story. The first one or ones to publish will get an A for that percentage.

Month one: Introduction to news writing, the lead and the inverted pyramid. How to order and reorder news stories, using real stories taken from real media. Month 2: Learning how to do it: making a hodgepodge of facts into an interesting newspaper story. Month 3: Paring it down: writing for radio and news agencies.

Month 4: Stretching it out: writing for magazines
