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## SYLLABUS FOR FOUNDATIONS IN CRIMINOLOGY

Course description: This course is an introduction to criminology. It covers many theories and concepts relating to criminology and sociology. We will study techniques for measuring the characteristics of criminals, crimes, and victims and trace the history and evolution of criminology. Furthermore, we will study criminal behavior from the biological, sociological, psychological, and sociopolitical perspectives. Finally, we will examine crimes from a legal standpoint.

<u>Course objectives:</u> Upon completion of this course, students will have a good understanding of why people commit crimes, the different types of crimes, and defenses to these crimes.

Learning outcome and assessments: All of the students' work will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Knowledge of the subject matter from textbooks, lectures, discussions, research and outside sources;
- Ability to apply knowledge to current events and hypothetical situations;
- · Logical and critical thinking;
- Demonstration of achieving class objectives.

<u>Format:</u> This class will be an interactive learning experience. The class will integrate lectures, class discussions, group projects, debates, current events, and presentations. We will cover about two chapters per class.
