#### SYLLABUS

#### Course Description:

The **measurement** of factors in criminal justice and criminology **crime indexes**, legal research, data gathering and analysis emphasizing participant observation and survey methodologies, plus ethical issues in criminological research.

### Course Overview:

This course introduces the **student** without any **knowledge** of **statistics** to an understanding of how statistics are all around us. The exploration of bow to develop concepts for research, data gathering, organization, and analysis strategies, -and familiarity with reading and interpreting secondary statistics is integral to this course. In addition to class lectures, text readings, workbooks, and computer work sessions, this course offers the students an opportunity to develop their own participatory/nonparticipatory research activity.

### Course Obiective:

To create a comfort level for freshman and sophomore criminal justice students to that they can interpret qualitative and quantitative data in basic **criminological** research.
