**SYLLABUS**

Course Description:

The **measurement** of factors in criminal justice and criminology **crime indexes**, legal research, data gathering and analysis emphasizing participant observation and survey methodologies, plus ethical issues in criminological research.

Course Overview:

This course introduces the **student** without any **knowledge** of **statistics** to an **understanding** of how statistics are all around us. The exploration of how to develop **concepts** for research, data gathering, **organization**, and **analysis** strategies, -and **familiarity with reading and interpreting** secondary statistics is **integral** to this course. In addition to class **lectures**, text **readings**, workbooks, and computer **work** sessions, **this** course offers the students an opportunity to develop their **own** participatory/non-participatory research activity.

Course Objective:

To create a comfort level for freshman and sophomore criminal justice students to that they can interpret qualitative and quantitative data in basic **criminological** research.
