COURSE DESCRIPTION Professional Practice is a course designed to guide students in internships that reflect their specialization in the field of Interior Design. Students will research career opportunities in their specialized area and seek job opportunities available. Student's portfolios, resumes, and business stationary are assessed on an individual basis to determine readiness to enter the workforce. Students are required to complete **85 hours** of documented work experience in cooperation with the firm of their choice. Internship hours are not compensated. If paid internships are offered, compensation to be determined by the employer.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES Professional practice in the interior design profession including course work and analysis of appropriate employment specialties that support the individual goals and design talents of the student. The instructor will supervise internships, with visitations to the employment location or job site as needed.
