Barry Neulen is an adjunct instructor of Criminal Justice studies at Chaminade University. Introduction

This course discusses the principles of organization and administration of law enforcement agencies, focusing on management and supervision within different levels of a police department. The course examines policies, procedures, and techniques of various departments emphasizing the changing *roles* and requirements of modern policing. The goal of this *course is to develop the* student's understanding of basic managerial and supervisory skills, as well as the dynamics of leadership, and how they relate to a law enforcement agency.

Requirements_

Course requirements consist of two exams; a midterm and a final. The final exam is not cumulative. The exams ill be multiple choice, true/false and are based on the text, class notes and discussion. Also required is one written brief, (-2 typewritten pages in length (double spaced). The topic of the paper will be chosen by the student but should focus on one or more issues discussed in class such as organizational theory and structure, community policing, private policing, historical development, laws affecting modern policing, or the regulating of police agencies. The student must provide source documentation for the paper and should follow a format which includes an introduction, a body (relevant points), and a summary,
