Course Description and General Outline:

Discussion of the components of the Juvenile System, the processing of the juvenile through the Criminal Justice System, the rights of the juvenile, criminological theories relevant to juvenile delinquency and criminal behavior will be explored. Students will be required to relate theoretical subject matter with current events.

Attendance:

Attendance comprises of one-third of the **final** class grade (refer to **grading** policy). Upon three absences a deficiency notice will be sent to the registrar with the recommendation that the student withdraw from the class. Students who miss three or more classes will receive a grade of "FA- Failure due to poor attendance." On rare occasions, exceptions will be made due to documented military necessity and/ or serious family / or personal reasons. (NOTE: ALL ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE MADE AND CLEARED WITH THE INSTRUCTOR PRIOR TO ANY ABSENCES OR MILITARY LEAVE). In addition, it is also the <u>student's responsibility</u> to make the appropriate **contact** with the instructor.

Grading Policy:

Grades will be based on a point system. There will be a total of 400 possible points; 100 points for attendance; 70 points for articles/current events; 30 points for group **discussions;** 50 points for the mid-term; 50 points for the final exam; and 100 points for the written research project.

<u>70 points</u> - an article/current event relating to the class **will be due weekly**. Each student will present their article/current event orally to the class. (NOTE: there will be no articles due on the midterm and final exam days)

Group:

<u>30 points:</u> - each student will be expected to participate actively in the group discussions relating to the class.

Midterm & Final Exam:

<u>100 points</u> -the midterm and final will each count for 50 points. The midterm exam will consist of the **first** half of the course material and the final will consist of the second half of the course.

Research Project:

1 in - Students will prepare a written research paper (10 pages minimum, this does not include the title page nor the bibliography) on any topic relating to juveniles in the criminal justice system and make an oral presentation to the class. All papers must conform to the Chaminade University writing requirements.
