#### Course Description and General Outline:

Discussion of the components of the Juvenile System, the processing of the juvenile through the Criminal Justice System, the rights of the juvenile, criminological theories relevant to juvenile delinquency and criminal behavior will be explored. Students will be required to relate theoretical subject matter with current events.

**Textbook:** <u>Juvenile Delinquency</u>, **7**<sup>th</sup> ed., Siegel, L. & Senna, J., (2000).

Additional Course Materials: To be announced and/ or distributed by the instructor.

### Attendance:

Attendance comprises of one-third of the **final** class grade (refer to grading policy). Upon three absences a deficiency notice will be sent to the registrar with the recommendation that the student withdraw from the class. Students who miss three or more classes will receive a grade of "FA- Failure due to poor attendance." On rare occasions, exceptions will be made due to documented military necessity and/ or serious family / or personal reasons. (NOTE: ALL ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE MADE AND CLEARED WITH THE INSTRUCTOR PRIOR TO ANY ABSENCES OR MILITARY LEAVE). It will be the <u>student's **responsibility**</u> to communicate with the registrar regarding withdraws, add / drops, credit / no-credit option. In addition, it is also the <u>student's **responsibility**</u> to make the appropriate contact with the instructor.

## Grading Policy:

Grades will be based on a point system. There will be a total of 900 possible points; 100 points for attendance; 80 points for articles/current events; 80 points for group discussions; 540 points for Quizzes; and 100 points for the written research project.

## Breakdown of Point System:

#### Attendance:

100 ins - (students arriving on time, prepared for and participating in all classes will receive 100 points) Excused absences include military leave with orders, medical conditions (w/physician's note) and extreme emergencies.

90 points - 1 absence

80 points - 2 absence

#### Articles:

<u>80120 ints</u> - an article/current event relating to the class will be due weekly. Each student will present their **article/current** event orally to the class.

### Group:

<u>80 points:</u> - each student will be expected to participate actively in the group discussions relating to the class.

## Quizzes:

<u>540 points</u> - the weekly quizzes will comprise of 20 multiple choice questions each worth 3 pts., a total of 60 points per quiz. (Total of 9 quizzes)

### Research Project:

100 points - Students will prepare a written research paper (10 pages minimum, this does not include the title page nor the bibliography) on any topic relating to juveniles in the criminal justice system and make an oral presentation to the class. All papers must conform to the Chaminade University writing requirements.
