Course Description

An examination of issues currently faced by the criminal justice system focusing upon contemporary issues which are projected to have major impact upon the quality of life for the community and the ability of the criminal justice system to provide services to the community.

Course Objectives

The **objective** of **CJ375** is to stimulate the student to consider the operation of the justice system in the United States, the purpose of laws, and the justice received by certain groups within society. The aim of the class is to develop critical thinking skills, which can be applied to solve problems in public administration and criminal justice. At the conclusion of this course it is expected that the student will be able to:

- 1. clearly and logically describe a problem
- 2. evaluate the arguments and **facts** related to a problem
- 3. assess the seriousness of a problem
- 4. arrive at a reasonable conclusion to the problem and present that solution either orally or in writing in a persuasive manner

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Attendance

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Requirements Of **The** Position Paper

Position papers should be approximately 175 to 250 words in length. The paper should state a single thesis sentence or position and provide logical argumentation to support your position.
