Course Description

A comprehensive study of youth statuses and behavioral expectations; an overview of theoretical ideas of delinquency; the social context of delinquency; institutional responses to delinquency; solution-directed research and programs; ethical perspectives of public policy impacting treatment effectiveness on juvenile delinquent behavior.

Course Objectives:

1. Create an awareness and sensitivity to youth statuses and behavioral expectations in diverse environments;
2. Identify social impacts such as economics, race, family, culture, media, education, and religion on juvenile delinquent behavior;
3. Develop a team project chosen by majority vote that surveys attitudes regarding public opinion, legislative mandate, and administrative process on a timely topic concerning juvenile delinquent behavior.

Course Structure:

- The course has four components:
1. Lecture and analysis of readings;
 2. Survey and data analysis;
 3. Class and group discussions;
 4. Films and guest lecturers.
