### COURSE DESCRIPTION

ART 201 is an introduction to the visual arts, Eastern and Western, from Prehistory to the Gothic period, and is one of the courses fulfilling the general education requirement in the fine arts. The course will follow the text and grading will be heavily based on material in the chapters, and lectures by the instructor. THIS IS AN ABBREVIATED COURSE, THEREFORE INTENSIVE. WE COMPLETE 3 FULL CREDIT HOURS IN TWO½ MONTHS; THAT IS 3 TO 4 HOURS OF WORK PER WEEK PER CREDIT HOUR - 9 TO 12 HOURS OF WORK PER WEEK FOR

A TOTAL OF 3 CREDIT HOURS. Please be prepared for this work load.

# **OBJECTIVES**

to survey the great stylistic and cultural periods of Early Art History chronologically, from Prehistory to the Gothic, Eastern and Western Art to critically review the effect of art principles on culture and on the individual - to develop skills in critiquing art works to become aware of the many ways that art permeates our lives and our culture

to analyze a work of art within its culture in order to understand art as an expression of multi-culturalism

to appreciate Hawaii as part of both Eastern and Western art traditions

## REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to be open-minded in class discussion and to participate in all class assignments and discussions. Each student is expected to carefully read the assigned chapter in the textbook, take a weekly open book quiz and discuss the chapter. Only registered students are allowed to be in the class.

All students will be graded on the following requirements: Be courteous and professional in class discussions, i.e., allowing others to express their ideas with tolerance. Communicate in a positive, constructive way.

Show respect for differing ideas and opinions of class members.

**Turn** in assignments on time for full credit.

#### TEXT CHAPTER REPORTS

Each student will be **assigned** a chapter from the textbook and must turn in the following on the designated day when the student gives the report to class and takes a leading role in class discussion:

A 2 page, minimum, (typed, double-spaced) summary of the chapter including: 3 main points from the reading, clearly stated in bullet or number format, with an explanation of each main point [3 = A, 2 = B, 1 = C] Include information you learned from an online or real museum or gallery visit exhibiting art that is relevant to your chapter

3 analytical questions for class discussion [3 = A, 2 = B, 1 = C]

# (Be sure you understand the meaning of the word, "analytical.") RESEARCH PAPERS

The purpose of the project is for students to creatively apply knowledge of **art** principles from different eras of art history learned in the classroom to the cultural environment around them. The research methodology includes a literature review, museum or gallery (online or real) exhibit analysis, survey and/or interviews.

The research papers must be double-spaced, typed, and a 12 size font. Plagiarized work will lead to failure of the course, and it **will** be reported to the university for disciplinary action. Please see the General Catalogue, page 50.

# SUMMARY OF RESEARCH PAPER- Oral Report

Each student will have 10 minutes to share their research with the class. The oral report should be a brief summary of the student's written paper. Reading from the written report is discouraged and points will be taken off.

The grade will be based on the criteria given before the presentation.
