Week 1 Lesson 8 Birthday Invitation

Week 2 Make an invitation card.

Write an essay about the self, family, classes, everyday subjects, personal experience in Korean. Understand and read short essays and newspaper articles.

Week 3 Lesson 9 Barbershop and Beauty Salon

Week 4 Korean through film (video viewing sessions and discussion)

While watching Korean films, one can learn Korean expressions used in everyday life. Selected films or TV dramas are used in conjunction with lessons not only for listening comprehension and classroom discussion, but also for enhancing their understanding of Korean culture. Writing assignment is given as the follow-up exercises.

Learn about special food for special occasions. (New Year, Korean Thanksgiving Day)

Tasting a "Songpyeon" (rice cake)

Learn common proverbs and idioms, and learn about holidays and customs.

While studying Korean songs, one can learn Korean naturally and enjoyably. Students will learn grammar, sentence structure and pronunciation.

Week 12 Describe the photo: This activity is just to describe the given photo as much as you can. Photos are used since they show real life and provide visual aids which help your understanding.

Talk with the photo: Instead of describing the photo, you use it as talking point. Depending on the photos, this activity might be more difficult than the first one, but it is more interesting since it allows you to be more creative and talk about your personal experience.

Week 16 Final Exam

Visit the Korean family and Korean Language School in Neighbor Island.

Teach the basic Korean Language and experience a Korean family life style while staying with them.

Final grading will follow the traditional scale:

90-100 = A Outstanding scholarship and an unusual degree of intellectual initiative
80-89 = B Superior work done in a consistent and intellectual manner
70-79 = C Good work demonstrating competence in Korean language
60-69 = D Lowest passing grade
Below 60 = F Failed to grasp minimum requirements of course
