Materials

A *classical guitar* (a wide-neck guitar with nylon strings) is required for this course. A guitar case, footstool, guitar tuner and metronome are recommended. Rental guitars are available through CUH.

Music will be recommended according to your needs. However, you'll also play an active role in music selection. Plan to spend \$25 to \$30 per semester on music.

Knowledge of the guitar's repertoire is necessary to select music wisely. To gain this knowledge, study guitar recordings and scores, and attend guitar concerts.



Lesson Policies

- One lesson is given per week until the Chaminade Recital near the end of the semester. After the recital, lessons are finished. No class on holidays.
- You are expected to attend all scheduled lessons. Make-up lessons are not given for no-shows or last minute cancellations. Three or more unexcused absences will result in a failing grade (NC).
- Be on time for your lesson. I will not continue teaching beyond your scheduled time if you're late.
- A make-up lesson will be considered if you give at least a 24-hour notice. However, make-up lessons will be given at my convenience and are not guaranteed.

Course Objectives

Here are the student learning outcomes (SLO):

- Demonstrate the ability to perform solo repertoire at the achievement level for your year of study.
- Demonstrate the ability to sight-read.
- Demonstrate facility in executing scales, arpeggios, slurs and position shifts.
- Demonstrate poise and confidence as a performer.
- Demonstrate the creative and technical tools to use the guitar as an artistic means of communication.

Student Objectives

To realize course objectives you must:

- Attend all scheduled lessons.
- Complete all assignments.
- Practice 30 minutes or more daily. Practice sessions should contain technical exercises, sight-reading and solos.
- Perform in the final recital at the end of the semester.

- The skills used in the performing arts in a hands-on, practical experience within a learning community in music and/or theatre.

Final Recital

You are encouraged to perform in the CUH Recital at the end of the semester (date to be announced). **All private study students are required to attend the recital.** However, beginners may be excused from performing if the instructor deems them not ready.

Evaluation

Grades are assigned as credit (CR) or no credit (NC). Credit standing is determined by your attendance, growth and dedication as a guitarist and musician. If you practice

your assigned solos, sight-reading and technique 30 minutes or more daily you can expect exciting results and a passing grade (CR). See "Lesson Policies" for impact of unexcused absences on your grade.
