Senior Seminar is designed to provide students with an opportunity to research, prepare, and present forensic science topics of interest to them. Reading and discussion of recent forensic techniques and applications will be part of the preparation and presentation process. One oral presentation by each student is required. Prerequisites: FS 340/L.

OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Research a forensic science topic for presentation
- 2. Prepare an abstract of the presentation
- 3. Prepare a professional curriculum vitae and/or cover letter
- 4. Recognize the appropriate and efficient use of visual aids in presentations
- 5. Prepare and deliver concise and professional presentations

ATTENDANCE:

Attendance is mandatory. Students will be required to sign a sign-in sheet at the beginning of each class. When not presenting, students will be expected to actively participate in the presentations of their peers by asking questions and making constructive comments; participation will be graded. Repeated absences will be reported to counseling and will result in possible removal from the course, as per the CUH Student Handbook.
