COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will discuss the nature and process of news writing. It will concentrate on the process by covering mastering of the patterns of newswriting, developing story ideas, completing research, shaping articles, writing, editing, and evaluating production values. Students will learn how to vary the style and content of their writing in terms of the intended audience.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To provide an understanding of the news writing process
- 2. To introduce students to the various types and conventions of news stories
- 3. To develop grammatical and stylistic accuracy
- 4. To learn how to complete writing assignments based on the needs of the audience

COURSE COMPETENCIES:

All written work must be typed.

- 1. Write your own obituary. This should be an extended obituary with at least one quote. You may make up the facts for this one. This should be at least 250 words long.
- 2. Write an article about an event. You will need at least one cited source for this one. The article must at least 250 in length.
 - Write an article about a Person. This article will need to cite at least two other sources besides the subject. The article must be at least 500 words.
- 4. Write an article about a concept or idea. A concept or idea includes an academic program, a school policy, a new fad, or, in fact, anything that catches your fancy. The article must be at least 500 words in length.
- 5. The last assignment is an article on a subject of your choice. Three sources, with at least one coming from a non-live source (i.e. another paper, the library, the net) must be included. This article should be at least 1000 words long.
