Syllabus

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AR 480 – 01 – 1 Advanced Oriental Brush Painting

Description : Students continue to develop their mastery of basic brush painting techniques used by Asian artists, particularly those in Korea. The student transitions toward landscape compositions, exploring technical and aesthetic issues in advanced composition and the traditional spirituality inherent in the process of creating Asian art. This course is repeatable for credit. Prerequisite : AR 380 – 01 – 1 or permission of the instructor.

Program Learning Outcomes :

Students successfully completing the minor will demonstrate :

1. confidence and skill in the application of their personal creativity and perspective to their projects :
4. an understanding of the value of the process of creation rather than merely the value of the finished product ; and

- apply advanced techniques of oriental brush painting to their personal projects (PLO 1 ; P 3)
- demonstrate their understanding of the theory underlying Asian art. Particularly Korean brush painting traditions and schools (PLO 4).
- create a work for the final exhibition that demonstrates their relative
- mastery of the advanced techniques and composition (PLO 1 ; P 3)
- critically engage each others' art as a means to understand constructive criticism and improve their own work in light of a peer review process. (PLO 4)

 - a. Preparation of " Mug "shades of black and color ;
 - b. Compositional forms and empty space ;
5. Woodblocks Printing : calligraphy and paintings ; (Week Ten -eleven)
6. Landscape Oriental Brush Painting ; (Week Twelve)
 - a. Techniques of Landscape
