**CATALOG DESCRIPTION:** NUR 406 Evidence-based Practice Practicum (2 credits): This is a clinical course and will provide the student the opportunity to apply evidence-based practice theory in the clinical setting.

5. Generate a problem oriented evidence based practice project for presentation to clinical facility staff or client population.

**Course Design:** NUR406 Evidence Based Practice Practicum is a continuation of NUR404 Evidence Based Practice. Students in NUR404, working in teams at community based clinical sites, engaged clinical staff to identify a clinical problem. Using the Johns Hopkins Nursing Evidence Practice Model, teams developed an EBP question that addressed the clinical problem. As a team students appraised 20-25 articles (5 per student) to discover current evidence to support a change project for the clinical site. In NUR406 teams will work together to translate the evidence into an EBP-based project. Teams should adhere to the timeline in order to finish in the first 7 weeks of the semester. Based on the project, the evaluation stage may extend past week 7 but this should be arranged but all actual projects should be completed before week 8 to avoid conflict with NUR499 Clinical Immersion.

**Schedule and Assignments:** For Team Work you should try to use Mon 1030-1520 and TH 1230-1530 when you are all already on campus. You will need to schedule educational presentation/in-services at the facilities at times convenient to them and your team. Know that all team members do not have to present every time – you will have to work around your other clinical as well. **NOTE: The final Clinical Report & Poster are Team assignments. Each Team will submit ONE Report & Poster and each student will receive same individual score after grading.**

## SERVICE LEARNING

**SUMMATIVE STATEMENT:** In light of your four years in the School of Nursing, you will reflect on the impact of your service-learning on the community, as well as your personal and professional growth through service-learning. Develop a summative statement about this (2-3 sentences). Use the following quote to help facilitate your reflection:

*Service-learning is designed to help students develop an understanding of the context in which clinical skills are used. Students should complete a service-learning experience with a better understanding of the policy context of health care; the cultural differences in health-related beliefs, nutrition, and hygiene practices; and barriers confronted by some patients in obtaining health care and following medical advice. Exposure alone to diverse patients in a clinical setting does not guarantee better understanding of their situations or points of view and may simply reinforce prejudice and stereotypes. It is in the quality of reflection, of thinking about these complex health care issues and using experience to suggest questions for further exploration, that service is transformed into service-learning.
