RATIONAL:

The educarers / teachers in the field of early childhood need to have an awareness of developmental needs and a working knowledge of the skills necessary for optimal growth and development of the young child placed in their care.

Early childhood programs need to create learning environments that are healthy and safe so that children can feel free to learn. This Is critical for the development of an interdependent community of parents children, and staff. It is within such environments that children can be free to explore, discover and construct their knowledge of the world.

OBJECTIVES:

* To provide the educarers/teachers with a basic understanding of health and safety requirements appropriate for the young child.

* To provide the educarers / teachers with an understanding of how to create a supportive learning environment for the young child.

* To prepare the educarers / teachers with the knowledge **necessary** so that they will develop an understanding of program needs.

* To prepare the educarers **/teachers** with the skills needed to support the needs of children and their families.

* To establish positive and productive relationships with families.

The goal of this experience **may** be different from the O & P assignments that you have had In the past.

The goal is to observe the environment

physical environment including the materials, schedules and strategies

the Interaction of the adults remembering that the adult is part of the environment

YOU NEED TO ANSWER THE **QUESTION**......HOW DOES AT LEAST ONE OF THESE ELEMENTS SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENTAL NEEDS OF THE CHILD SOCIO-EMOTIONAL (including diversity)

PHYSICAL (gross motor and fine motor) COGNITIVE (learning styles) SPIRITUAL (the es-sence of what brings life together)

You do not need to Identify the program by name. You need to identify the ages and the group size and the number of adults in the environment. You do **need** to note if there was something unusual that was occurring that caused a change in the program . (fire drill or inspection) During the last week end you will share your **observations** and a summary. Focus on what you have learned about meeting the young child's needs.
