COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will focus on the definition of evidence-based practice and the application of evidence to inform nursing practice. The research process as related to qualitative and quantitative methods as well as other sources of data will be explored.

In the fall 4th year students take NUR404 EBP Theory and NUR403 Nursing Leadership throughout the semester. The content complements each other. NUR404 EBP Theory is linked with NUR406 EBP Practicum in spring; the EBP clinical project is identified and evidence appraised in fall and the project planned, implemented, and evaluated in spring, ideally in the first seven weeks of the semester.

The goal of this two course EBP series (NUR404 and NUR406) is the creation of a well-designed undergraduate EBP project addressing a nursing or health related problem in a community setting (non-acute care). This may include community based clinical sites for Public Health Nursing or Mental Health Nursing, previous sites of Complex Disease I in SNF or LTC facilities, or any community agency (personal interest of Team Member or workplace if in community setting). The Team will help solve a practice problem related to health, healthcare, or nursing practice in the community.

Prerequisite Courses: Senior standing in nursing program

- 1. Describe each step of the evidence-based practice process.
- 2. Utilize problem solving as a basic concept essential to the nursing, research, and evidence-based practice process.
- 3. Apply learned concepts by using clinical scenarios to create a PICO question about the effectiveness of a nursing intervention.
- 4. Conduct a literature review using Boolean operators.
- 5. Conduct critical appraisal activities for various evidence sources.
- 6. Generate a problem oriented research project for a scholarly paper.

- The assignments are listed in Canvas (and the course schedule) with specific directions and expectations under the appropriate weekly Module. For credit, all deadlines should be met unless arranged previously with instructor. Follow instructions in Canvas. These assignments are completed individually *unless otherwise noted*.
- Assignments will help the student understand the fundamentals of nursing research, the EBP process, and lead him/her through the steps of designing a project. As a TEAM MEMBER each student must stay current with assignments to contribute to the team's success. The project will be actualized in NUR406 Evidence Based Practice Practicum in the spring semester.
- Students will work in Teams of 5-6 arranged the first week of the semester in the NUR403 Leadership section. All Team Members must be in the same Leadership section to facilitate collaboration. No exceptions.

Available Resources: Library services are available for nursing students who need help with Boolean searches and research. *Our CUH librarian will present to the Leadership course - see schedule. You should plan to attend to facilitate your success - and it contributes to your EBP course grade.*

Course Grading: Students must inform instructor via email of any late assignments. Late written assignments in this course will receive an automatic 20% deduction per day past the due date unless previously arranged with instructor.
