ED 416 -THE PHONICS PLUS METHOD OF TEACHING LANGUAGE ARTS Chaminade University - Summer Session

The PHONICS PLUS course is designed to assist the teacher in his/her program to teach language arts. It will provide the teacher with an accurate and practical method to teach using phonics as a foundation for spelling, speaking, reading, and writing.

Course texts:

Approaches to Beginning Reading by Robert Aukerman The Writing Road to Reading by Romalda Spalding Common Ground by Patricia Vail

Materials (required):

The Writing Road to Reading Set of phonogram cards Composition notebook No. 2 lead pencils 1 red pencil

Grading (optional):

Students will be graded on attendance and participation, daily quizzes, and a written and oral final exam. In addition:

Daily homework will be assigned and should require 1-2 hours of study. Students are expected to review the presented phonograms and continue to write vocabulary into their notebooks. Homework is corrected at each class session.

- 2. A written comparative paper and oral presentation will evaluate the student's comprehension of the Phonics Plus approach to teaching spelling and reading. Students will select an approach/method and prepare a written and oral presentation.
- 3. Students will be required to present a mini-lesson.
