Field Observation Write-Ups (_4)

- After each field observation, a 3-5 page paper is due that includes a
 description of classroom visit. The description should include the
 following: grade level, subject lesson, environment, behavior issues,
 organization of class and any other pertinent issue that caught your
 attention.
- The written report should also include a theoretical reflection that ties in some aspect of Ed 406 course content with what was observed in the classroom. (eg. developmental theory, learning problems, motivation theory etc.)
- The paper should be typed with one inch margins, double spaced, and in standard English.

Notebook

• Each student must keep a notebook for in-class assignments. This should include all individual writing assignments and small group work done in class. It must be kept separate from class notes.
