## Ed 442 - Music and Creative Movement for Teaching

This course is based on the Orff Pedagogy of teaching multicultural music to children. As educators, sequencing is important with every learning process starting with a total general impression from which differentiation will be made in rhythm, pitch, singing, listening, moving, playing, and creating. Movement and Orff instruments provide an equilibrium for developing coordination, ability and new skills which make the child more open for the magic of the beau of music.

## **Course Requirements**

Instruments: Students are responsible for supplying their own 'ukulele and recorder. You are expected to practice each instrument at least 15 minutes three times a week.

Attendance is mandatory! Failure to attend class may result in the lowering of your grade.

Projects: All Projects are to be typewritten. Where applicable, include the music score with your lesson plan.

Project #1 - a three to five page paper summarizing on the sociology, philosophy, methodology, or psychology of music education OR a three to five paper that reviews two articles on music education research that can be found in periodicals such as the Music Educators Journal.

Project #2 - A formal lesson plan with one speech activity (with rhythm syllables) and one recorder/'ukulele activity.

Project #3 - A formal lesson plan with three or more music activities that are topically linked (a "theme" such as animals, Native American Indians, the Wild West) and extended to integrate with other subject areas.

Project #4 - Develop a music unit plan (at least five music activities) for a particular grade level with a theme. This assignment is to be handed in the last day of the
