#### **Course Description:**

- S. know how to provide developmentally appropriate art experiences for children in the various preschool and elementary grade levels
- 6. continue to build confidence in the artist within oneself
- 7. recognize his or her growing visual aesthetic awareness
- 8. encourage children to share their feelings and experiences through art.
