### COURSE SYLLABUS

Required Text: Frank Wachowiak, Robert Clements. Emphasis Art

It will be assumed that all text reading has been done outside of class time on a timely basis

As described in the Chaminade catalog this course will:

emphasize the four areas in discipline based art education (DBAE); Art History, Aesthetics, Criticism and Production.

- introduce art styles, art history and methods to introduce them into the classroom.
- through hands-on experiences Introduce basic art materials and techniques to encourage the personal ability of classroom teachers and to create in them a positive attitude toward art and its role in basic education.
- study the creative developmental stages of children and how to provide appropriate art experiences suitable for the various age levels.

#### Class outcomes and indicators:

The students will....

1. Develop basic artistic skills through art experiences in studio classes by exploring various media and techniques (paint, printmaking, drawing, sculpture, clay).  
-Criteria for studio projects: creativity, workmanship, effort and appreciation.
2. Develop aesthetic standards, design concepts, and basic art history through the viewing of art slides, audio tapes and videos.; a tour of the Honolulu Academy of Art ; and classroom critiques.
3. Understand child mental and creative growth and development as it relates to art teaching through readings and art lesson plans that show age appropriate application in a classroom.

#### Assessment based on course requirements:

1. Portfolio of all studio finished assignments (50)
