An education in the Marianist Tradition is marked by five principles:

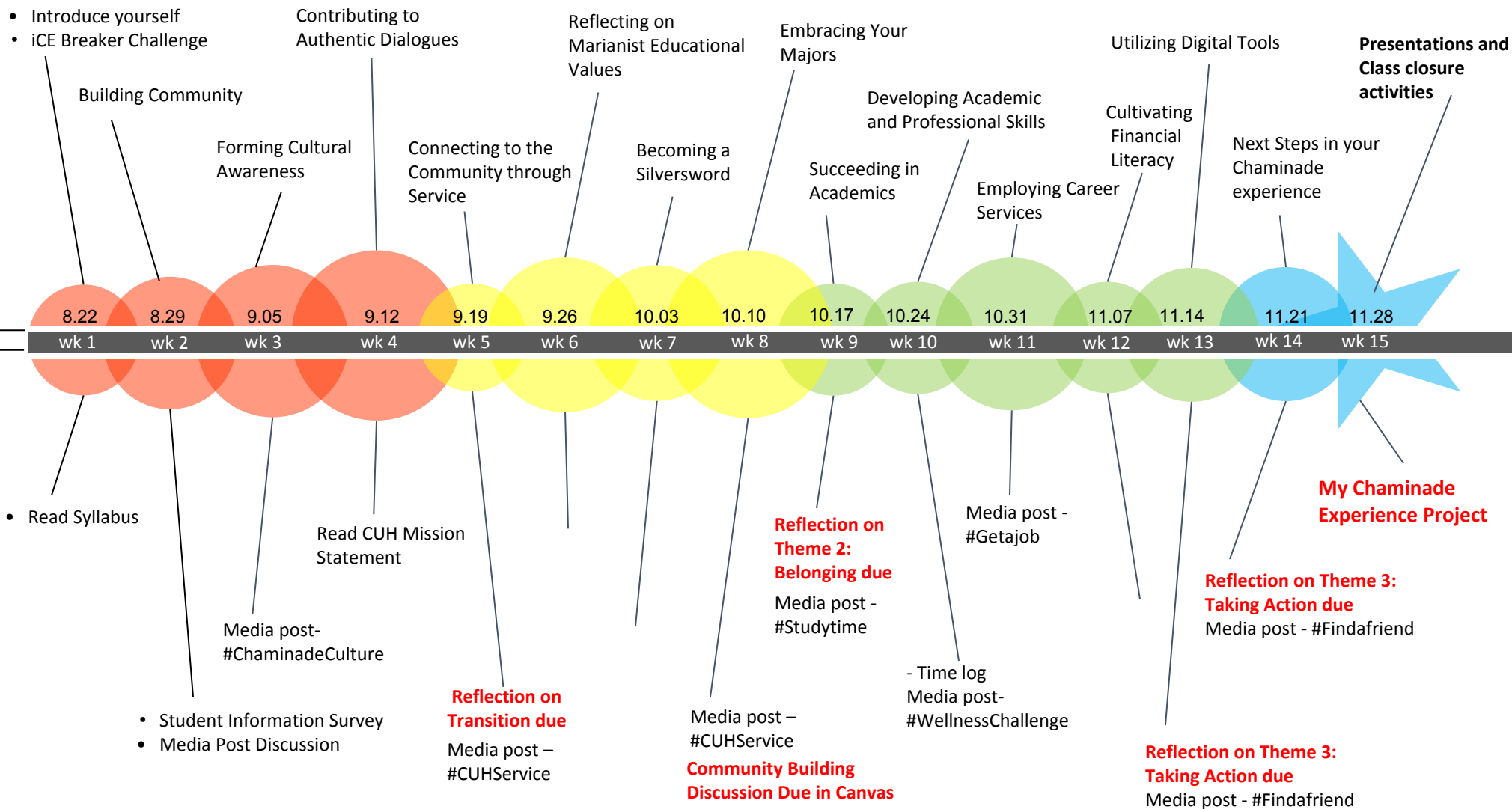
1. Education for formation in faith
