**Catalog Course Description**: Administrative professionals in the public sector and non-government organizations (NGO'S) must understand and cultivate working relationships with various levels of government and community partners. This course looks at theory and practice of governmental relations within a democratic, federalist system. Focus is on operations and interactions among city/county, state, and federal agencies and how NGO'S can effectively and efficiently engage and interact with these various levels of public governmental agencies. Specific attention is given to state and city/county relations in Hawaii.

### **Course Objectives:**

- Acquire and demonstrate an understanding of the interdependence of NGO'S and various levels of public governmental agencies in developing and implementing public policy.
- Acquire and demonstrate an understanding of the practical aspect of how the various levels of public government agencies relate to each other.
- Acquire and demonstrate an understanding of the practical aspect of how NGO'S can effectively engage with the various levels of public government agencies in relation to (and not limited to) contracting and funding.
- Demonstrate the ability to present case analysis with strategic recommendations.

**Course Requirements**: Students must come to class prepared to participate and interact in class assignments. The ability to demonstrate and effectively communicate your thoughts, ideas, and position on issues/topics will be considered in determining a student's grade.

**Attendance:** Attendance is mandatory.
