

HU 126-90-4: Catholic Social Teaching – Spring 2021 Course Credits: 1 Class Time: Monday @ 3:30 – 4:20

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### **Course Overview**

We will explore what Catholic Social Teaching is about and why it is important for Catholics and all persons of good will to understand the teaching and apply it in their lives. We will explore what the teaching says to you, the student, and how it may help you make good decisions in support of your families, communities, and nation. The first part of the course deals with the concepts, and the last few weeks will be devoted to applying the concepts to issues in Chuuk and the Federated States of Micronesia.

### **Marianist Values**

This class represents one component of your education at Chaminade University of Honolulu. An education in the Marianist Tradition in marked by five principles and you should take every opportunity possible to reflect upon the role of these characteristics in your education and development:

- 1. Education for formation in faith
- 2. Provide an integral, quality education

- 5. Educate for adaptation and change

### **Native Hawaiian Values**

Education is an integral value in both Marianist and Native Hawaiian culture. Both recognize the transformative effect of a well-rounded, value-centered education on society, particularly in seeking justice for the marginalized, the forgotten, and the oppressed, always with an eye toward God (Ke Akua). This is reflected in the 'Olelo No'eau (Hawaiian proverbs) and Marianist core beliefs.

- Discuss the foundations of Catholic Social Teaching in Catholic theology (PLO 2)
- Explain the source methods of Catholic Social Teaching (PLO 3 & 4)
- Identify the seven key themes of Catholic Social Teaching (PLO 1 & 3)

• Share examples of how Catholic Social Teaching can help the local Church and communities in Micronesia.
