### Course Objectives:

The course objective is to introduce students to literature in English from Beowulf to Milton. In analyzing and discussing the works, we will also hone our critical thinking and writing skills.

## Course Requirements:

- b. Two papers (7 pp.) will be required. Papers must follow the guidelines for written work.
- c. There will be a final exam.

#### Guidelines for Written Work:

- a. All work should be typed and double-spaced on standard-sized white paper. Please use a standard-sized font.
- b. Include a cover page, with your name, course number, and my name, as well as the title of your paper.
- c. Attach a list of references to the end of your paper.
- d. Proofread your work. Papers with grammatical or spelling errors will be marked down.

**HELPFUL HINTS:** Title of plays and novels are underlined (<u>Oedipus Rex</u>) or italicized (*Oedipus Rex*); titles of poems appear in quotation marks: ("Ozymandius.")
