History 151: World Civilizations I Dr. Yamasaki

Course Description

Survey of world history from earliest times to about 1500. This course attempts to link students with major people, events and developments that shaped the world we live in.

Course Objectives

After completing this course, students will have...

- a working knowledge of the key people, events and developments in world history.
- refined their reading, writing, speaking and cognitive skills.
- engaged in learning that embodies cooperation, self-discipline, caring and mutual respect.
- developed their concern for social justice, ethics and civic responsibilities.

Course Requirements

- Regularly attend and actively participate in class meetings. Turn in short writing assignments.
- Take four examinations during the semester.
- Write two historical essays.
- Turn assignments in on time: All assignments are to be turned in to the instructor, in class, during the class hour, on the day they are due. Papers turned in to the instructor's mailbox or under his office door will not be accepted. For short writing assignments, no late papers will be accepted. For historical essays, 5 points will be deducted for each class meeting beyond the due date.
