HISTORY 152 WORLD CIVILIZATIONS II

CONTENT: This course surveys world civilization from about the time of the Renaissance and Reformation through the early Cold War. It attempts to cover the main political, social, and economic currents of the times.

TEXT: Adler, Philip. World Civilizations 2nd Ed. Vol II. Belmont, CA, Wadsworth 2000.

REQUIREMENTS: Students are required to attend class and are responsible for coming to class prepared by reading the assigned material. Students will write a learning log answering a question or two about the topics discussed in each class. Students will present a mini-lesson on one topic during the course. Students will take one midterm exam and one final exam. The exams will be partially objective and partially essay.

GRADING:

Grade percentages are 90-100 = A; 80-89.9=B; 70-79.9=C; 60-69.9=D; below 60=F

Grading distribution is as follows:

- 20 percent Learning Logs to be graded at midterms and final exam
- 25 percent Mini-Lesson Presentation
- 25 percent Midterm Exam
- 30 percent Final Exam

The mini-lesson presentations will be graded for telling what happened (34%), why it happened (33%), and telling its effects or implications (33%). The students will choose from the topics listed on the back side of this sheet. They will be entirely oral and will be done during the class period to which they apply.
