- 4) Work cooperatively within a group to achieve a common goal.

## Grading: Students are expected to:

- 3) Actively participate in class discussion and activites as directed by the instructor.
- 4) Fulfill all writing assignments both in and out of class.
- 5) Work effectively within a group.

### Student grading will be evaluated as follows:

- 1) Two essay examinations (one midterm and one final) 50 pts.
- 2) One 5 7 page paper. 25 pts.
- 3) Two quizzes. 20 pts.
- 4) Attendance, class participation and weekly assignments. 25 pts.

#### Weekly Assignments:

- 1) Students shall turn in weekly assignments for review by the instructor.
- 2) Students will be asked to present their findings in class.
- 3) Assignments will be due in class on that Friday session.
- 4) Assignments will be used as part of class discussions, and active participation is encouraged.

- 2) Each paper must be typed, double spaced.
- 3) Margins all around may not exceed one inch.
