Course Description: A survey of European history from the Age of Discovery through the Contemporary period.

Course Objectives: At the end of the course, each student should:

- 1) Know the methods used by historians and other researchers to uncover the past.
- 2) Demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the various factors that contributed to the rise of Western Civilization.
- 3) Communicate orally and in writing factual highlights of Western Civilization.
- 4) Work cooperatively within a group to achieve a common goal.

Grading: Students are expected to:

- 1) Regularly attend class.
- 2) Be responsible for all material covered in class.
- 3) Actively participate in class discussion and activities as directed by the instructor.
- 4) Fulfill all writing assignments both in and out of class.
- 5) Work effectively within a group.

Student grading will be evaluated as follows:

- 1) Two essay examinations (one midterm and one final) **50 pts.**
- 2) One 5 - 7 page paper. **25 pts.**
- 3) Two quizzes. **20 pts.**
- 4) Attendance, class participation and weekly assignments. **25 pts.**

Weekly Assignments:

- 1) Students shall turn in weekly assignments for review by the instructor.
- 2) Students will be asked to present their findings in class.
- 3) Assignments will be due in class on that Friday session.
- 4) Assignments will be used as part of class discussions, and active participation is encouraged.

### Guidelines for Papers:

- 1) Each student will submit a short paper (5-7 pages)
- 2) Each paper must be typed, double spaced.
- 3) Margins all around may not exceed one inch.
- 4) Font size may not exceed 12 pitch, pages must be numbered
- 5) Proofread your papers for grammatical and typographical errors.
