COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course looks in depth at the 1960s and early 1970s. We begin with the background of post World War II America, then dig into the various currents of change in the 60s/70s: politics, foreign policy, music, entertainment, civil rights movement, civil liberties, the War on Poverty, the Vietnam War, etc. We end with a look at the Watergate scandal bringing down the Nixon presidency and its implications for the growing cynicism in America.

ASSIGNMENTS: Students are expected to read the weekly assignment before coming to class and to be prepared for class discussions. Class attendance is required. Two exams will be given. Exams will be half multiple choice and half essay

The grading percentages are as follows:
