COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course surveys the history of the Middle East and Southern Europe from 3000 B.C. through the fall of the Roman Empire. It covers ancient Egyptian, Greek, Hellenistic, and Roman history, politics and culture in great detail.

ASSIGNMENTS: Students are expected to read the weekly assignment before coming to class and to be prepared for class discussions. Class attendance is required. Three exams will be given. Exams will be multiple-choice. There will also be a paper presentation to the class.

The grading assignments are as follows:

- 25% Midterm Exam II
- 25% Final Exam

The papers must have a topic designated on. The presentation summarizes the paper for the class. It will be graded with the following rubric:

- 35% what are the implications
