SUPPLIES: Wagner Color Deck and Dictionary (available at bookstore). Art supplies: Set (24+) of colored art pencils; 2 full sheets of 140 lb. hot-press, water-color paper; *gouache* opaque water-color pigments (medium-intensity red, medium-yellow, medium-blue, black and white), #8 -#10 synthetic, round watercolor brush; small plastic palette; water jar, HB pencil and white plastic eraser, straight-edge, compass or large circle template; 16"x20"(quarter sheets) of mat board.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: To develop, through observation and articulation, a *visual memory* of color and offer the tools to understand the many applications of color in interiors. The course will cover the basics of standard color theories, physics of light, and the visible spectrum, pigments, visual perception, color in history, color marketing in design and theories of color and human response as they impact interior design. The textbook material will be augmented with a video and lecture material from the Wagner Institute of Color, many studio color projects and an individual color design program and case study, various assignments and studio color blending techniques.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Homework assignments 35%; quizzes 30%; Color Project and Case Study 20%; Midterm 5%; Final examination 10%. Identify your written papers with the class and

date; the assignment number; your name on each sheet. Staple the assignment hand corner. Presentation boards should have the same information on the back.
