d. To develop skills in the design of kitchen and bathrooms.

e. Students will be required to design and develop a Materials and Components Reference Notebook including purchase orders and work orders and also specification information on all materials and techniques covered in the class.

f. Class lectures will be supplemented with visits to vendors and suppliers as well as guest speakers whenever possible.
