Design projects will be returned to the student with a written evaluation.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: To gain a working knowledge of the common use of materials and components that comprise the built environment, interior architecture and interior design. The student is expected to:

> Use correct materials terminology.

> Understand the characteristics of paints, wallcoverings, flooring materials and stones, and to properly design, specify and measure quantities.

> Build a design vocabulary and visual memory of upholstery fabrics and materials, floorcoverings, window treatments and soft goods, and to properly measure and order materials, fabrics and goods for installations or fabrication.
