Studio case study will be evaulate by the instructor and returned to the student with a written evaluation and score.

Course Description: To introduce students to a practical application of previous class studies to residential interior design, ecology and architecture. The class studio will consist of a detailed case study of a student designed *Natural House*, according to factors defined in the text and class lectures. Students will demonstrate their knowledge of following instructions, programming and planning a design project, architectural and interior design and drafting, universal design elements, material selection and specification, color, textiles, interior and exterior materials and furnishings, the Principles and Elements of Interior Design, preparation of presentation materials and an interior design vocabulary.

Student's discussions of the textbook material will be a regular feature of class meetings. PLEASE READ ASSIGNED TEXT CHAPTERS BEFORE EACH CLASS AND BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS THE CONCEPTS IN CLASS.
