ASSIGNMENTS: Please read the assigned text and handouts before each class. Student participation in class discussions is required. All written work is to be printed on a computer in a simple font style. Identify the cover page with your name, and class (ID 316) Submit your work in a presentation folder. Material boards are to be

clearly labeled on the back with name, date and class. Drafting is to follow the legend and labeling requirements of ID 220 and computer drafting to follow requirements of ID 318. Assignments are due on the date assigned at the beginning of class. You will receive points off for every day your assignment or presentation is late. Design projects will be returned to the student with a written evaluation.

ATTENDANCE is mandatory. Four unexcused absences may result in a failing grade. Please see instructor if you have two unexcused absences in a row. Tardiness and leaving the class early will also reflect against the student's final grade. Absences on exam days due to illness may be excused with proof of proper medical verification. See the instructor to make up the exam before the next class meeting. No phones or audible pagers are allowed in class. Please see the CUH Student handbook for information on University policies relating to student's code of conduct. This will be strictly enforced.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:

Contract design refers to the interior design of non-residential environments. It is also referred to as Commercial Interior Design and the terms may be used interchangeably in class. The complete coursework will be divided into 2 semesters of instruction and students are advised and encouraged to enroll in both classes. Class work will consist of lectures and discussions from reading materials, slides and discussions of space planning and finishes in the contract environment. Supervised studio work, design teams, guest lecturers and field trips will round out the course schedule. Students are required to participate in discussions and to use correct contract design vocabulary terms. The text *Contract Interior Finishes* by Hall is to be used as a contract specification standard and guideline.

The intent of course work in **ID 316** A is to offer an insightful overview of the programming, planning, design and specification of interior space as it relates to various types of offices and health care facilities. **ID 316** B will be concerned with the study of the hospitality industry, food and beverage facilities, and retail design.

The classes will expose the student to:

- > An overall appreciation of contract design specialties and facilities management.
- > Contract project organizational procedures
- > Contract programming and planning, design and project development
- > Improve project presentation skills with formal presentations
- > Commercial drawing and drafting requirements
- > Contract specification, Master Spec and Sweets catalogues
- > Attention to barrier free space-planning applications in contract design
- > Contract materials and components, furnishings
- > Improve basic communication and writing skills, enhance modes of self expression, critical thinking and analysis of information
