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A. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

An introduction to spoken and written Japanese, this course is the second part of a two-semester sequence. Students are expected to apply their knowledge of the language by participating in drills, exercises, role-playing, and other activities to facilitate the learning of structural patterns and sounds of spoken Japanese. Students are expected to have a working knowledge of loan words in katakana. Reading and writing of hiragana syllables will be covered in this course.

B. COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. to develop an understanding and appreciation of another culture through language learning.
- to acquire basic skills in listening comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing.
- 3. to gain further proficiency in reading and recognizing katakana loan words.
- 4. to be able to read and write hiragana syllables.
- 5. to gain a working knowledge of culturally appropriate behavior in interacting with Japanese people.

In addition to scheduled chapter examinations and quizzes, there will be unannounced "pop" quizzes for which no make-ups will be given. Students will be allowed to make up all other scheduled quizzes and exams (except the final) on the condition that the instructor is notified beforehand of the student's absence. Also, students should be aware that pop quizzes may be administered at any time during the class period; therefore, attendance for the the entire length of class is strongly advised.

E. LANGUAGE TAPES:

Language tapes are available at the Media Center on CUH Main Campus. Students are required to listen to tapes as many times as needed. There may not be adequate time in class for drills; therefore, students are to utilize tapes to enhance their oral/aural proficiency. Assignments are included on the tapes. Students will be tested for their aural proficiency of dialogs, useful expressions, and drills for each lesson.

All assignments must be completed and submitted by the due date, usually at the next meeting, unless stipulated otherwise by instructor. No credit will be given for late assignments.
