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## MA 09801 Syllabus and Course Expectations

Mission: Through collaborative learning to give the student experience of working with persons who are diverse in possibly several aspects.

**Objective:** To enable the student to add, subtract and multiply polynomials and to divide polynomials by a monomial.

Assignments: Assignments will be given each class day. They are due at the next meeting of the class.

Quizzes: A quiz will be given at each meeting of the class. It will be based on the material in the assignment that is due the same day.

**Participation:** I expect you to work together, to help each other. Attendance at class meetings is basic to that expectation.

**Calculators:** You may use a calculator in class only when I explicitly invite you to do so.

**Tests:** There will be no tests.

Final: Those who elect and successfully complete the <u>SHINE</u> <u>Service Learning</u> option will be exempt from a Final Exam. For those who are not exempt, the Final will be on Wednesday, 12 December at 10:30.

Grade: Your grade is computed by averaging your averages in participation, assignments, quizzes and the Final (or Service Learning).

## The Service Learning Option

The Service Learning Option involves volunteering in community service and reflecting (in writing) on that experience.

The community service to be done by those electing this option is concerned with tutoring elderly immigrants who are preparing for naturalization as American citizens. They need tutoring in things pertaining to the civics of American government and in preparation for the citizenship test.

The program sponsoring this tutoring is called **SHINE**: Students Helping In Naturalization of Elders.

Tutors are required to take the SHINE training. It will be held on Saturday, 8 September from 9:30 to 1:00 and on Tuesday, 11 September from 4:30 to 7:00. You must attend both sessions.

When you complete the training, you will select a tutoring appointment that will match your schedule. The tutoring sessions are held off campus and generally in the evening. You must tutor for 13 weeks, one hour a week.

Each week you will complete two tasks: 1) a journal of reflection. I will supply questions for you to respond to in this journal. 2) a journal of observing and calculating. For this journal, you will some observations in your setting and perform some calculations based on those observations. The observations will consist of counting persons or books; measuring various dimensions; keeping track of your time; and so on. Each week you will receive instructions on what to observe, how to make the measurements and what to calculate.

Students in MA 09801 who participate in the SHINE Service Learning are exempt from the MA 09801 Final Exam.
