## COURSE: PSY 304 Psychology of Adolescence

### **DESCRIPTION**

<u>Interview</u> due Sept., 12. You will interview (in depth) 1 person and discuss the theories covered in Ch. 2 which theory/theories make "sense" to this person – how do they see development during adolescence – why defend! Your typed, double-spaced writing will be 3-4 pages in length and discuss the theory itself, your interview, and your opinion in relation to the text and the interview.

You will create a question, investigate this question in a journal (research), and relate your research to the text. The question will be the <u>title</u> of your paper and the writing will be an attempt to answer the question.
