Course Description: The role of psychology in human experience as it relates to sexuality: development of individual self-concepts regarding sexuality as they relate to locally accepted behavior.

Course Goals and Objectives: To gain an understanding of the scientific study of human sexuality and an increased wisdom of individual self-concepts regarding sexuality. Explore the nature of sexual development (*biological, cognitive, social, emotional, personality*) along with current problems and health issues. This mode of investigation should allow for a controlled inquiry to develop an objective, effective, and credible way of knowing.

Methods and Procedures: Text study, lectures/discussions, videos, guest speakers, projects/class presentations, and exams. Exams will be a combination of multiple choice, fill in the blank, and essay.

## Project/Class presentation

The purpose of the project is for you the student to gain information on the subject of human sexuality. To accomplish this you will conduct research, prepare a paper, and deliver a class presentation on an area of human sexuality; i.e. anatomy, hormones, contraception, morays.

Your research project must be approved in advance by the instructor, all topics must be submitted by 5 February 2000 for approval. After you topic has been approved you will prepare a typed written report of approximately five pages discussing your topic and listing references. All reports will be uploaded at <http://www.TurnItIn.com>; Each student should locate the region of the world where your institution resides; Select the region; Select the university; Select the class; Complete the 'Submission Request Form;' Cut-and-Paste the appropriate sections of the term paper into the appropriate boxes; They will only accept the last paper submitted by a particular student (i.e., if a student submits their paper 10 times, they only take the 10th paper); They will not check the reference section of the paper for 'unoriginality' because that section typically contains exact information that is found in many works; It is important that a student enter an Identification Number that is unique to themselves (i.e., one number per student).

Typed reports are due on 4 March 2000. Presentations will be given on 4 March 2000 and 11 March 2000 on a first come first serve basis. Based on the sign up sheet.
