Course Description: PSY 406 Counseling Psychology, 3 credits, Counseling approaches and techniques used in helping relationships. The course combines experiential and didactic instruction, giving the student an opportunity to explore helping strategies and develop a philosophy of counseling. Prereq: Psy 101 and Psy 321

Required Text: Theory and Practice of Counseling and Psychotherapy, Corey.

Method of Evaluation: This is a 100 point class. Extra credit is possible.

Weekly Class Quiz: 40 points (8 wks x 5 points). Weekly Class Experiential Exercises: 10 points Weekly Class Group Activity: 10 points

Mid-term 5 page paper on:

"General Approach to My Philosophy of Counseling" 20 points Final 5 page Paper on:

"Detailed Approach to My Philosophy of Counseling" 20 points

Extra Credit: Extra credit is at the discretion of the instructor. Typically, extra credit is offered in response to above average class participation in recognition that individuals and groups have unique learning/expressive styles.

Attendance: Attendance is the policy of Chaminade University. Inform the instructor if you have specific circumstances that will impact your attendance. *Deployment*, *standing duty*, *work*, *and personal/family needs are examples of specific circumstances*.

Mechanism of Class: This is an interactive class. This means that the instructor and students are entering into a learning relationship. We will both have our work to do and unique contributions to offer.

Description of Assignments:

Weekly Class Quiz: This is a short 2 question quiz. One question will assess knowledge of a technical term or theory; one question will ask for an applied approach to a specific situation. Content for quiz will come from previous weeks lesson, content will come from the textbook.

Weekly Class Experiential Exercise: Each week the instructor will offer opportunities to the students to practice active listening skills, case conceptualization skills, diagnostic skills, and therapy techniques. Role playing of a non-invasive nature will be part of this exercise.

Weekly Class Group Activity: Each week students will be introduced to a specific facet of counseling called group counseling. Over the weeks students will experience in brief format the process of forming, interacting in, and transitioning out of a supportive group experience.

Mid-Term Paper: "General Approach to My Philosophy of Counseling" is an opportunity for the student to integrate theory, technical information, research information, and personal/professional experiences into a unique philosophy of counseling. Student will have the opportunity to describe and name their own approach. Literature based theory will provide a reference point from which to build one's own theory. PAPER IS DUE BY THE FIFTH WEEK OF CLASS. Students will briefly present their ideas to classmates on the day designated as Mid-Term.

Final: "Detailed Approach to My Philosophy of Counseling" is an opportunity for the student to "go deeper" into the development of their approach to counseling. In this paper student will be required to describe the "content" and "process" of their approach. In essence this is a refinement of the work done for the mid-term. PAPER IS DUE BY THE TENTH WEEK OF CLASS. Students will briefly present their ideas to classmates on the day designated as Final.

It is recommended that both papers be in APA format. It is required that papers be provided to instructor in a hardcopy format, typed, and singlespaced.
