The scope of this course will be an examination of the domains of consciousness, self, behavior, strategy, decision making, spirit, social interaction, and therapeutic intervention from the perspective of Taoism. The course will explore Taoist psychology as found in the I Ching, Tao Te Ching, Chuang Tzu, Lieh Tzu, and Sun Tzu. In order to assist the student in understanding Taoist psychology, the relationship between the Taoist perspective and the contemporary psychological perspectives of humanistic psychology, cognitive psychology, and existential psychology will be examined. To assist the exploration of the psychological approach of Taoism, Ch'i Kung, and Taoist breathing exercises will be taught as part of the class.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Student will develop a basic understanding of Taoist psychology. 1.
- 2. Student will be able to differentiate between the Tao Te Ching, Chuang Tzu, and Lieh Tzu relative to psychological focus.
- 3. Student will develop a basic understanding of humanistic, cognitive, and existential approaches to therapy.
- Student will be able to differentiate between humanistic, cognitive, and existential 4. approaches to therapy.
- 5. Student will be able to compare and contrast Taoist psychology with humanistic, cognitive, and existential therapy.
- 6. Student will develop a basic understanding of the psychological components of strategy/war as found in the work of Sun Tzu.
