## OVERVIEW:

This survey course will deal primarily with the major religious traditions of the world, and how each belief system provides meaning, articulates absolute values, and gives direction to its adherents. The student will be introduced to the traditions of the Middle-East (Judaism, Christianity, Islam), South Asia (Hinduism, Buddhism), and East Asia (Confucianism, Taoism, Shintoism). By exploring and examining the phenomena unique to each tradition(i.e. myth, ritual, scripture, dogma, religious practice, religious institution) the student will gain an objectively oriented insight into the ways in which religion(s) have affected and been affected by the human community throughout history.

Questions will be taken from lectures, readings, videos, etc. (Term identification, short answer/essay, T/F, multiple choice, etc.). Vocabulary/word list will be given to each student for terms to know, understand, comprehend, internalize...Supplementary research possibilities. Content subject to

change with ample notice given to student.
