OVERVIEW: This course is designed to provide the student with an opportunity to examine contemporary social issues which the Christian community encounters. The framework for ethical reflection that the student will develop will be based on relevant biblical and theological assumptions that Christianity brings to the debate on these social issues along with the methodologies that bring about social change within the context of the Christian community.

REQUIRED TEXTS: Moral Issues and Christian Response. Jersild and Johnson

CLASS PROJECTS:

- 1. Maintain a journal on any issue relevant to our coursework. The subject matter must be consistent throughout your compilations. A minimum of ten (10) entries are required. Paste article on facing page, then give your written personal reflections on the opposite page.
- Each student is required to give a class presentation on any contemporary social issue. The presentation should be ten (10) minutes in length with an outline turned in prior to the presentation. The presentation should include an ethical framework, the identification of the issue and how it relates to the Christian community, and possible solutions.
- 3. A final major term paper on a topic of interest to the student. The theme and subject matter will be the same as he verbal presentation and will be due on the last day of class. The length should be between ten (10) and fifteen (15) pages. Follow the attached guidelines and your paper will be a success! Bring a large manila envelope, stamped and addressed for return of your paper.

PRELIMINARY OUTLINE: In addition to the textual topics covered we will discuss issues surrounding the life ethic: abortion, right to life, euthanasia, transplant/bioethics matters, human progression from birth to death and beyond; the future: expectations, inquiries, alternate societies, other cosmoses, altered states, channelling; the history of Christian response to plagues (HIV/AIDS), racism and other forms of blatant and latent elitism and superiority, prejudice, evil, crime, punishment, the homeless issue, the attraction of cultic and occultic worship, etc......
