#### Catalog Description:

Examines the contemporary social issues which confront the Christian community, the relevant Biblical and theological assumptions that Christianity brings to the debate on these issues, and the methods to bring about social change within the context of the Christian community.

### Course Requirements:

Social ethics require that all students contribute to the common project of learning, so everyone must keep up on readings, participate in class discussions by offering their opinions and insight, and maintain the process itself by creating an environment of mutual respect and engagement. Students will be expected to complete assigned reading, participate in class discussions, and complete a 5-10 page position paper on a particular issue. In addition, there will be a comprehensive final exam.

### Grading criteria:

Evaluation will be based on class participation (25%), the position paper (40%), and the final exam (35%). Students who miss more than one session can expect to have their final grade negatively impacted.
